211 DAY

February

Utah 211 works to connect members of our community to health and human resources, as well as meaningful volunteer opportunities. Utah 211 is a free and confidential service, available by phone or website 24 hours, 7 days a week.

211 Day is an annual outreach event in which 211 Utah and United Way of Northern Utah partner to share the statewide 211 resource with our communities. 211 Day, February 11th, serves as an exciting opportunity to hold an intentional outreach event in which we look at areas of high need in our community and share information accordingly for the greatest impact. With support from fabulous volunteers and staff, 211 and UWNU canvass neighborhoods with informational door hanger flyers that share what resources are available and how to connect with Utah 211.

READ ACROSS AMERICA

March

"You're never too old, too wacky, too wild, to pick up a book and read to a child." So said Theodor Seuss Geisel, better known as Dr. Seuss. It is clever phrasing for such an important task. Reading to children is one of the best things we can do to help them start and stay on a path to success.

Read Across America Day is a nationwide reading celebration that takes place annually to recognize Dr. Seuss's birthday. United Way of Northern Utah partners with local elementary schools to teach children the importance of literacy and how much fun it can be to read.

Other activities to support early literacy may also be included in our Read Across America celebrations, such as installing lending libraries throughout the community and encouraging use of public libraries.

Volunteer opportunities for this event include reading to children and installing lending libraries.

DAY OF ACTION

June

Every June, local United Ways in hundreds of cities nationwide participate in United Way Day of Action. Day of Action focuses on advocacy to improve our communities access to health, education, and income. United Way of Northern Utah hosts an advocacy-focused volunteer event to engage companies, community groups, families, and individuals to take action in projects that support our strategic plan and goals.

Advocacy projects will be selected based on community needs and alignment with United Way of Northern Utah's mission and goals.

Volunteer opportunities for this event will be based around the advocacy projects selected each year.

DAY OF CARING

September

United Way's Day of Caring brings together thousands of volunteers across the nation. Day of Caring harnesses the volunteer spirit and improves the conditions of communities in which we live.

Locally, United Way of Northern Utah creates and supports a fun volunteer event to engage companies, community groups, families, and individuals in service that benefits Northern Utah communities and nonprofit organizations.

Service projects will be selected based on community needs and alignment with United Way of Northern Utah's mission and goals.

COMMUNITY DRIVES VEUWEN

For years, United Way of Northern Utah has been a leader in promoting community drives that affect our Community Schools and other local agencies in our service areas of Box Elder, Morgan, Oneida, and Weber counties. Our schools and partner agencies are often in need of new items to support the families they serve. The in-kind donations that we receive from individuals, groups, and corporate sponsors help the children in our community and their families by alleviating their financial burden or food insecurities. In 2019, we received nearly \$80,000 in in-kind donations. From diapers and backpacks to new coats and frozen turkeys, these donations help our communities thrive.



Volunteer opportunities for community drives include: hosting a community drive, receiving donations from throughout the community, and distributing donations to the community recipients.



BOOK DRIVE

January-February

Every child needs a book. Children who are read to more frequently at age 4-5 achieve higher test scores for both reading and numeracy by third grade. These differences in reading and cognitive skills are not related to the child's family background or home environment but are the direct result of how frequently they have been read to prior to starting school. The most successful way to improve the reading achievement of children is to increase access to books. At United Way of Northern Utah, we encourage families to read to their preschool children and provide a way for families to build their children's library by giving them books. In 2019, over 6,000 books were collected and distributed throughout the community.



COMMUNITY BABY SHOWER

March-April

A Community Baby Shower is just that - baby gifts and supplies donated from the community and then given back to those in need. Individuals, groups, and corporate partners host baby showers, either as a one-time event or over a period of a few weeks. This support is central to the success of our program, Welcome Baby. Families receive a diaper bag filled with new essential baby items during the first home visit with their volunteer. Home visitors also take much needed baby items such as diapers, wipes, and children's books into the homes on monthly visits. These items help families who often could not otherwise afford them.

HEALTH & HYGIENE DRIVE

May-June

The hygiene supply drive ensures that families in our communities are set up for success, feel their best, and have access to basic health supplies. Many families don't have access to toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, and laundry soap. Good personal hygiene is a simple way to live a healthier life. The supplies donated through this drive will help individuals stop the spread of germs and fight common viruses and infections.

STUFF THE BUS SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

July-August

You can help children start a new year with confidence and supplies for school success. We partner with nonprofit agencies in our service area to ensure that every student is ready for school. From backpacks to folders and calculators to crayons, these donated items help remove the pressure from families in need.

SEASON OF SERVICE: WARM CLOTHING AND FOOD DRIVE

October-December

Help to share the warmth as we strive to ensure families have warm clothes during the cold Utah months. Donated clothing items are distributed to families in Box Elder, Morgan, Oneida, and Weber counties.

There are 36,000 people in Box Elder, Morgan, Oneida, and Weber counties who are facing food insecurity. When sponsoring our food drive, you are helping to feed hungry children and families in these four counties.

ONGOING OPPORTUNITIES

WELCOME BABY HOME VISITOR

Welcome Baby is a free community service for parents of young children from birth through three years of age. It is designed to promote a healthy beginning for parents, new babies, and their family members.

Trained volunteers visit parents monthly in their homes. They provide age-specific developmental information and tips, learning kits and game ideas, help with positive parenting skills, and give one-on-one support. Home visitors also discuss good health habits, school readiness activities, and family economic self-sufficiency. They also help connect families with resources in the community as needs arise.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Improve parent skills and knowledge of developmental milestones
- Support parents in preparing children to be kindergarten ready
- Improve mental health of parents (decrease child maltreatment)
- Improve physical health of children

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

- Commit at least six months to the program
- Attend at least one in-service training per quarter of the year
- Preference given to volunteers who have experience working with children and families especially experienced grandparents, parents, and couples

LEARN WITH PLAYGROUP

Learn with Playgroup brings together parents and children to build a community of peers to foster nurturing behaviors, provide social support, help families access needed services, and model developmentally appropriate practices.



PROGRAM GOALS

- Expose children to early childhood learning for kindergarten readiness
- Help families build social connections and learn parenting skills
- Introduce families to community resources

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

- Six month commitment to the program
- Volunteer a total of six hours per week (two playgroups per week for two hours each day, with up to two hours of preparation)
- Follow a provided curriculum to lead a playgroup of parents and their children ages 0-5 years old

ONGOING OPPORTUNITIES

AMERICORPS EDUCATION INITIATIVE OF UTAH (AEIOU)

Be a reading tutor or mentor for students to help them succeed in school and graduate on time. Children who fall behind in reading by third grade are three times more likely to drop out of high school. AEIOU helps fill in the gaps as the most-recognized one-on-one tutoring program in Utah, helping over 80% of its participants increase by three or more reading levels by the end of 30 weeks.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Increase tutoring and mentoring support from caring adults
- · Improve students' reading abilities
- Increase number of students graduating from high school

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

- A desire to make a difference for children
- A positive attitude toward reading and school
- Twice weekly commitment of 30 minutes each time for at least 10-30 weeks
- Willingness to attend a 1-hour training that will teach the tutoring methods we use
- Commitment to following our tutoring program methods and systems

PRO BONO BUSINESS CONSULTING

Help provide our local area nonprofits the knowledge, skills and support to achieve their missions. Without the needed expertise or training, it's difficult for nonprofit staff to perform all their job responsibilities. Engaging your employees to provide subject matter expertise through pro bono consulting is a great way to enhance the capability and the capacity of our local area nonprofits in the most meaningful ways. Support can range from one-hour virtual training to six-month projects where employees volunteer 2-5 hours per week.
